





Site Features

 - o serving up to 42 people
- Day Center and Severe Weather Shelter
- Two (2) sets of fences with privacy fence inside of existing fence
- Off-site parking for staff

Project Scope

- Low-barrier facility that will provide culturally responsive services to adults of all backgrounds
- Provide an environment of safety and support that allows guests to successfully engage in wraparound services that facilitate transition to permanent housing
- Include support programs through person-centered and trauma-informed care principles

Good Neighbor Agreement



Program Agreements

- Prohibit, and use best efforts to prevent the use or possession of illegal substances and alcohol
- Prohibit possession of any firearm or other dangerous weapons
- Adhere to noise ordinances and enforce quiet hours
- Ensure a minimum of two (2) shelter staff are on site twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week
- Respond to concerns and complaints about shelter programming, promptly investigate, and implement timely solutions when possible

County Agreements

- Ensure the shelter is run in compliance with all relevant federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and policies, including those outlined in the Operator agreements as outlined above.
- Ensure the Operator takes all steps necessary to create a safe, respectful, and secure environment for neighbors and for participants within the shelter
- Any changes to the design layout should adhere to applicable jurisdictional regulations, consider impacts to neighbors and businesses, and include community engagement

Sunstone way



- Started in 2021, Sunstone Way (formerly All Good Northwest) began operating 4 diverse shelter programs, with an emphasis on robust wrap-around care and on-site behavioral health services.
- Sunstone Way current programs include:
 - WEIDLER VILLAGE (formerly BIPOC Village)
 - o NAITO VILLAGE (formerly Queer Affinity Village)
 - MULTNOMAH SAFE REST VILLAGE
 - MARKET STREET CONGREGATE SHELTER
 - ROCKWOOD BRIDGE MOTEL SHELTER
 - MOBILE HOUSING RETENTION
 - CLACKAMAS VILLAGE (opening spring 2025)





















Our Mission: "We partner with neighbors to unlock a sustainable sense of home."

- Sunstone Way provides more than 300 shelter beds per night
- To date, we have helped transition over 560 participants into housing with many more making progress towards permanent housing
 - Services Provided within Shelter Programs:
 - Housing Navigation
 - o Case Management
 - o Behavioral Health Support
 - Peer Support
 - o Retention Services

- Our Model:
 - o Trauma Informed
 - Housing first, but not housing only
 - o Harm Reduction
 - Holistic Resource Navigation
 - Strengths Based







Our behavioral health program offers employees a pathway to becoming Qualified Mental Health Associates (QMHAs).


We value **lived experience.**Many of our staff have lived in shelter at one point in their lives and now, give back by working in this field.
