Collaboration: develop process content for CBAC supplemental recommendations letter	Chair led the committee in collecting and confirming what committee members think should be included in the section of the supplemental recommendations letter that addresses the CBAC's process this fiscal year. • CBAC Chair put process- and emerging issues-related comments from the letter content survey into a shared document. • Disparity in funding for culturally specific services needs to be highlighted; \$17M is still not enough.	

- Acknowledgement of local political landscape and difference in this year's budget and how it impacts our ability to provide feedback in a meaningful way
- We haven't seen Keith Wilson's plans with regard to Housing First in our process, and we'd like to hear Housing First perspective from the County chair and commissioners
 - Reasonable to comment on challenges we face in our process since we don't have insight into or influence on the City's budget
- County should address armed nature of Rapid Response Team
- Disappointed/missed opportunity that no County officials came to CBAC about shortfall and cuts and getting additional revenue
- In another CBAC, members ranked program offers, and focused on things that had to be cut and prioritized what could be added back
- Central CBAC looking at updating program offer template, asking what kind of additional info would be helpful to have when reviewing program offers: information shared via spreadsheet, list of top contractors, show more years of financial data
 - That's outside of the department's control; set by Central Budget Office
 - Hard when department combines program offers to compare year to year
- Timeline concern is the critical process issue
- Q: Does HSD have a list of prioritized programs they would add back in? A: We know employment services is one, but will know more once we have Chair's budget CBAC Chair asked what committee wants to highlight in emerging issues section
 - Even with different funding streams, the City's services affect people in the County; so can County provide alternatives to problematic ones? Just seeing sweeping and shelters, but this budget doesn't address that
