


The Provider Conference was well organized


The conference sessions allowed for meaningful engagement




I learned new information at the Provider Conference



The event location (Mount Hood Community College) was accessible and met my needs 39 responses




The event accommodations (rooms, refreshments) were accessible, and met my needs 38 responses

- Sessions about; 1) housing first as a concept -- it feels like 'housing first' is thrown around a lot, but then people advocate for shelter (or other things) as steps before housing. I would love for orgs to be educated about how they could truly approach housing placement from a housing first approach. 2) DV resources for housing and navigating support for folks experiencing DV 3) Supporting LGBTQIA2S+ people (especially trans people) in housing placement, this would be great to make sure that more and more providers have cultural competency in supporting trans folks in a non-harmful way.

- Uniqueness/importance of cultural specific providers.
- it felt odd not to have an opening session or something that brought us together before people went their separate ways
- It might interesting and worthwhile to have a housing developer (affordable housing, or any kind actually - the latter might be a harder sell naturally) give a presentation on what it takes to get an affordable housing project from idea/plan to having tenants move in, what the process entails, what are the challenges, what slows things down, etc. Another idea would be a zoomed out perspective on our region and the current state of

homelessness (you've probably had this kind of presentation previously?), comparing the key metrics from the most recent studies on the state of homelessness, whether via PSU or other research studies, to those same metrics 10/20/30 years ago in the Portland Metro area.

 I'd like to see some HMIS-specific programming. Maybe some on-site office hours for people to bring questions or data quality issues to figure out? Perhaps a AMA-style session? Would need to take care to use training site data so people aren't seeing live data from clients, but I think it's a great opportunity.

- I found the presentations to be very dry and largely consisted of being talked at for 90 minutes. I think it would be beneficial to encourage presenters to have some type of room engagement built into their presentations.
