Main Points from Session Overview/Presentation:

- New goals and strategies
- This round included more robust outreach to community and providers
- Quarterly HRAP data dashboard
- Homelessness inflow continues to increase
- Budget would need 50% increase to start decreasing homelessness in FY27 and FY28

Tables on 4 topics - Inflow, Safety on/off the Streets, Outflow, Care Coordination & Cross-Sector Collaboration

Questions/Answers:

- Q: Will use expertise of community orgs with community advisory committee? That committee is already established. Steering and Implementation committees are electeds and bureaucrats. Current committee includes folks with lived experience, service providers, corrections, DA, behavioral health, etc.
- Q: Graph of homeless, sheltered, unknown - how does someone land in unknown group? All of the data is from HMIS, based on people who are engaging in services in some way. Count of unsheltered/sheltered is based on their status on last night of each

month. Unknowns are folks we aren't sure where they're at on last day of the month.

- Q:Criminal Justice or Foster care system, are they involved in supporting people who might exit to homelessness? HRAP works with partners in health, criminal justice and foster systems to partner in the work of getting/keeping people housed. Cross sector collaboration is an example.
- Houseless may prefer living in car or on streets to living in shelter. Why are people not entering into shelter? Is this factor considered in planning? What are the wrap around services available in shelter, what experiences have people had in shelter, etc? Each Key Performance Indicator has sub-indicators that can be measured and tracked - 'desireability of shelter' is sort of in the mix.
