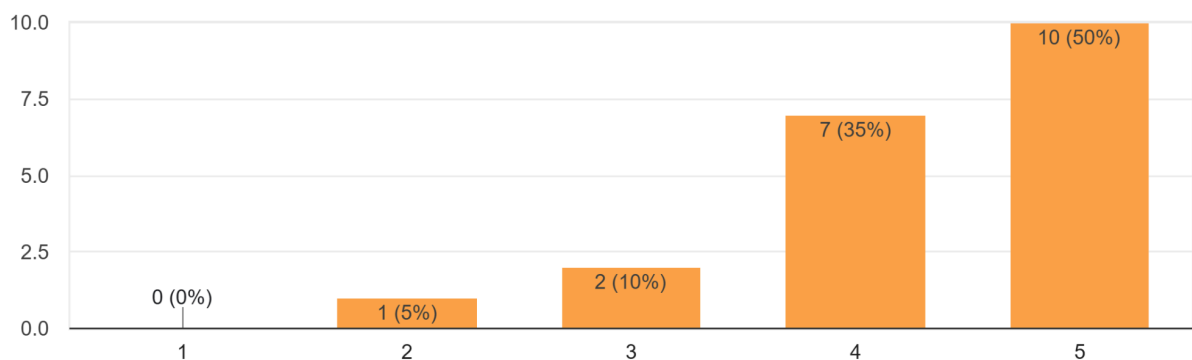

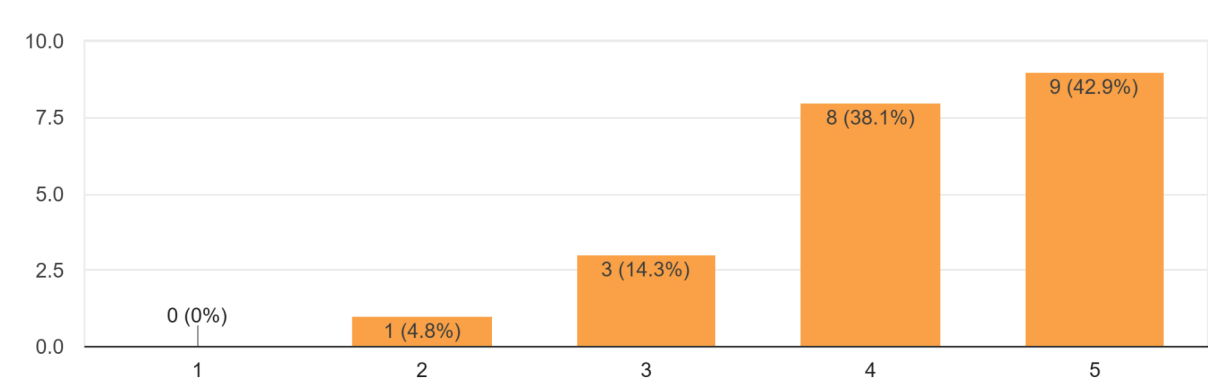

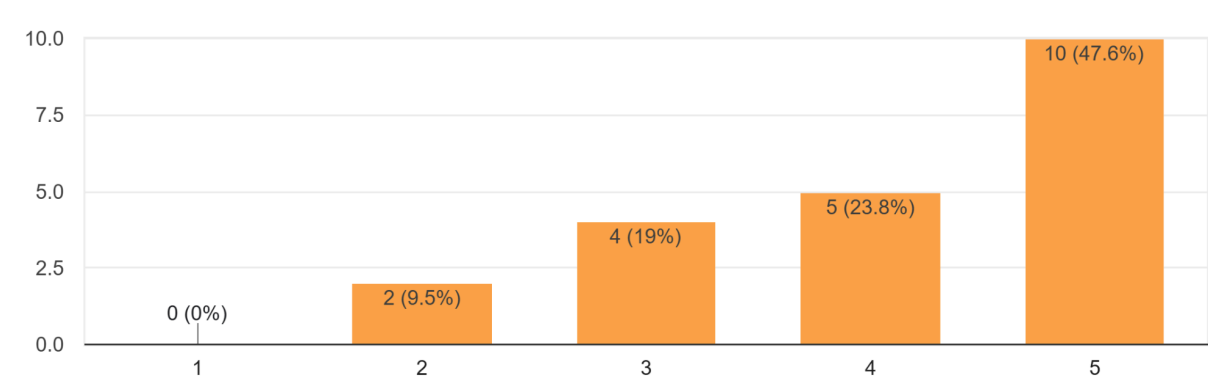

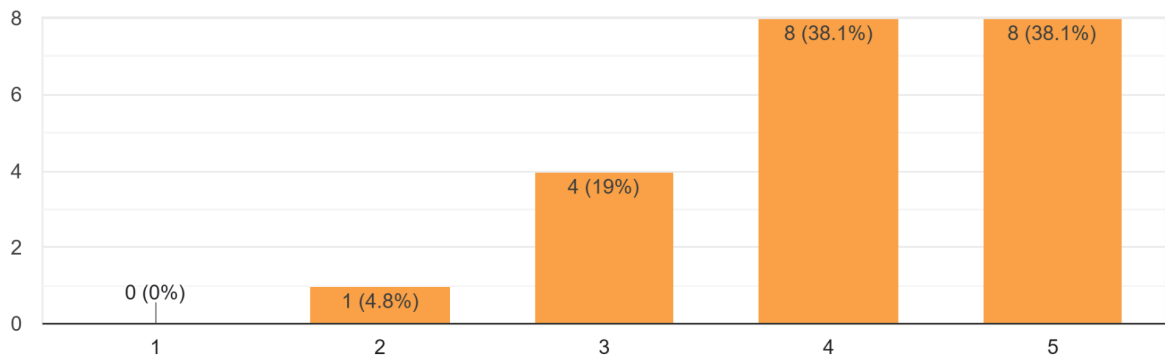

- it was an interesting session and i think the information was applicable for us.
- While there were parts of this session that were helpful we weren't really left with a lot of practical tools. At the end of the day there still isn't enough mental health supports for the # people who need them and housing providers are trying to juggle these without adequate support or flexibility from experts in those fields. Until we figure out the mental health scarcity in our community most guidance for frontline workers remains inadequate
- Valuable information. Most useful presenters were from Multnomah County. Ensure panelists are direct service providers/clinicians to improve this, rather than admins.

It would've been nice to hear about concrete projects or things each team is working on.

- I think it would be helpful to have more information about the path participants take when they are accessing behavioral health support.
- The presenters fell into a pattern that bled too much time during Q&A: one person would ask a question, and rather than the most applicable individual responding, each panelist felt like they needed to respond (even when the question had already been addressed). CBH was the most egregious here.
